Hello Residents,

We are happy to announce another positive change at Rosewood beginning soon. You deserve the best and we have partnered with a new service provider, Preferred Podiatry Group. This company has been in the business of providing high quality podiatry services since 1972. Dr. Martin will be the doctor caring for you. She is compassionate and a dedicated doctor who is the mother of a daughter and twin boys. We are looking at her first visit to be in October; you will be notified of the day she will begin seeing new patients at Rosewood. If you would still like to see Village Podiatry we will support that as well.

Here are a few things about PPF that you may want to know:

- 1. The PPG Podiatrists will visit you approximately every 61 days, or more often if necessary
- 2. A preliminary examination will be performed to evaluate the residents' foot care requirements; follow up care will be rendered to only those with special needs where it is medically necessary
- 3. All PPG podiatrists will comply with OBRA and OSHA guidelines
- 4. Yes, PPG does take assignment

So how do you take advantage of this new service when needed? Simply fill out their new patient form which can be obtained at the nurse's station, Tracy Scott's office, Tammy Davidson's or Rhonda Sharp's office. By signing this authorization form you are allowing PPG to treat you and bill Medicare and your supplemental insurance carrier. You only need to sign this form ONCE prior to the visit. Here is how billing will work: Authorization form signed and billing information obtained, resident evaluated and treated, initial billing statement is sent to the primary carrier such as Medicare, PPG takes assignment, therefore, Medicare is responsible for (80%) of the claim.

We look forward to happier and healthier feet throughout Rosewood! Thanks for being the best residents ever...please let the staff know how we can better serve you.
