
Saluting Our Veterans — November 11th

- » The Statue of Liberty was gifted to the US by the French on Christmas day in 1886. It weighs 225 tons and thus you could consider it as the biggest Christmas gift in the world.
- » It's believed that the origin of Christmas dates back to ancient Egyptians and Romans, who marked the winter solstice with evergreens as a reminder that spring would return soon. But it wasn't until Prince Albert of Germany introduced the tree to his wife, Queen Victoria of England, that the tradition really took off.
- » The first Christmas card design is thought to have been printed in England in 1843. The design was of a family party, beneath which were the words "A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to You."
- » In 1647 Oliver Cromwell, English Puritan leader, banned the festivities of Christmas for being seen as immoral on such a holy day. Anyone who was seen celebrating was arrested! The ban was lifted in 1660.






Pam is a dedicated Team
