FUN FACTS

- » December was originally the tenth month of the year in the Roman calendar. It gets its name from the Latin word "decem," which means tenth. However, when the Romans added January and February to the calendar, December became the twelfth month. They still kept its original name.
- » Gone with the Wind premiered at Loew's Grand Theatre in Atlanta, Georgia on December 15, 1939.
- » On December 17, 1903, Orville and Wilbur Wright, two brothers from Dayton, Ohio, ushered in the era of flight, and soared into history. Despite having no formal engineering training, the brothers defied gravity by making the first manned airplane flight in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina.
- » The first artificial Christmas tree was made in Germany, fashioned out of goose feathers that were dyed green!
- » Times Square became the go-to place for New Year's Eve revelers as early as 1904, but it wasn't until December 1907 that the New Year's Eve Ball made its first appearance.
- » The term Yuletide comes from a Norse tradition of cutting and burning a tree to bring in the Winter Solstice. This was to last through 12 days—later known as the 12 days of Christmas.
- » Frank Sinatra was born on December 12, 1915.
- » Illustrations in the first book version of 'A Christmas Carol' published in 1843 included kissing under mistletoe, something thought to have helped popularize the tradition.
- » In the 1790s, George Washington was the first U.S. President to serve eggnog. His recipe contained rum, whiskey, and sherry!
- » National Cookie Day is December 4th. Other snacks celebrated this month include pie, cotton candy, chocolate brownies, cocoa, and cupcakes.




Pam is a great leader and example for us all to aspire to be like! Congratulations, Pam! We are proud of you!
